




Emerging Leaders' Toolbox

The course is designed for women and men in their 20-30s who have some leadership responsibilities at work and would like to make a difference in their workplaces.

Whether you're leading a team, have recently taken on a management role, or are just taking your first steps in workplace leadership, this could be the course for you. The course is designed for young and emerging leaders in a wide range of sectors – including education, law, and healthcare, the business, public, and charity sectors, media and the creative arts, engineering

Emerging Leaders' Toolbox is designed around three core modules.

We know that life and work can be very busy, so each 24-hour module will run from 6pm on Friday evening to 6pm on Saturday evening. The course is very interactive, and you'll be learning as much from one another as from the training team. In each 24-hour module there will be a mix of up-front teaching, group discussions, real-life case studies, group project work, personal input, and time for reflection.

There will be a small amount of introductory reading and reflection before the first module. Between modules you'll need approximately 10 hours for reading and exercises related to your own work, as well as time to meet with your accountability triplet. You would be expected to commit to all three modules.


CORPORATE RATE - £750
